

ORIENTATION TO MEDSTAR NRH INPATIENT REHABILITATION

Level 1 Occupational Therapy Students

Students may be selected to come to MedStar NRH for their Level 1 Fieldwork. This experience is usually scheduled early in the curriculum and is a good introductory experience to inpatient rehabilitation occupational therapy. The student will be assigned to a fieldwork educator for the length of their level 1 experience. The student will have a chance to observe treatments, evaluations, and team meetings. Students are encouraged to discuss their goals with their fieldwork educator to increase collaboration and the successful completion of their goals and objectives.

Level 2 Occupational Therapy Students

Students accepted for a Level 2 affiliation will spend either 8 or 12 weeks at MedStar NRH. By the end of their fieldwork, OTR students will be expected to manage a caseload of between 5-7 patients and a group. OTA students are expected to manage a caseload of 4-5 patients and 2 groups. In addition to patient care, students will be expected to participate in team and family conferences, order equipment, attend all mandatory service meetings, and communicate with the interdisciplinary team.

Students should expect to complete documentation requirements outside of work time (evenings and weekends) or as time allows during the workday. This comprehensive, in-depth experience demands good organizational and time management skills as well as a motivated and flexible individual.
